Whole class instrumental programme

The whole class instrumental programme run by the music service is well into its eighth year and we currently have record numbers of primary schools taking up this offer. Our packages now include the opportunity to create bespoke CPD packages, concerts or immersion days.

But why should you do it? Increasing amounts of research demonstrate that children who learn an instrument do better at school than those that don't. Also schools are using music as a vehicle to drive improvement – there is an interesting article here on the subject:

Currently there are over 60 primary schools in North Yorkshire buying a package and many more running groups of eight sessions through the music service. We want this to grow further. Ambassadors are invited to:

- help spread the word about local music opportunities;
- attend social events and gatherings;
- take part in music training and workshops; and
- perform their own music.

Anybody aged 14-25 and living in North Yorkshire can sign up to become a NYMAZ music ambassador, and there are no costs or a particular level of musical experience required. All we ask is that participants love music, and want to make a difference!

The Ambassadors meet each Wednesday evening, 6pm -8pm, at Rural Arts in Thirsk. The group is open to anyone over the age of 14 who has an interest in music.

National Orchestra For All

Over the summer, five Northallerton music centre students took part in the first of three residential courses held by NOFA (National Orchestra For All). NOFA's mission statement is 'to unlock access to the life-changing experience of ensemble music-making for young people with complex lives'. With many of our students living in remote areas across North Yorkshire they were able to apply and receive bursaries to participate.

The music rehearsed and performed this season is based on exploring the relationship between music and dance. The students attended a four day residential, culminating in a performance at Leeds Arena in front of thousands of student teachers, the Lord Mayor of Leeds and the local MP.

All the students had a fantastic time. Here are some of the comments made by parents and our students:

'The music was exciting and having such a huge audience for the concert was fantastic!'

'I was very pleased to meet the three other double bassists and to work with them during the course as part of the lower string section ... I even got to play a solo!'

'I really enjoyed the tea time sessions where we divided into different groups: Samba, Choir, Tango, Baroque, Club Music, and Eastern European Folk Music and playing and singing music in that style.'

'As well as meeting musicians from all over the UK and working with inspirational tutors and conductors, I enjoyed staying at the university campus and getting a taste of uni life.' 'My child made some good friends from around the country from all backgrounds and the NOFA staff were excellent, very caring and friendly.'

'NOFA have been very supportive, and the whole event was professionally organised. They ensured that the children had fun. The variety and quality of music was brilliant. My child gained so much confidence from it and learnt a great deal about music as a whole. She is looking forward to attending the next session in Edinburgh with other musicians from the north.'

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Whitby music centre

with the combined ukulele groups. It was a superb afternoon of music and cream teas in aid of 'Spofforth In Bloom'. This has become a regular summer gig for these groups and we are thrilled to be able to perform in the community and support such good causes.

September saw two new members of staff join our team. We very pleased to welcome Sammy Spruce and James Gregg. Sammy is an exmember of Harrogate music centre and joins us having completed her music degree at Durham University. James will be taking over the running and directorship of HYJO. Our Wind Band played at the National Concert Band Festival in Manchester in November, the fundraising ceilidh in November and, of course, our Christmas concerts!

Harrogate music centre meets weekly on Saturday mornings at St Aidan's School in Harrogate. There are groups to suit all musical tastes and standards – ukuleles to double basses, saxes to violins plus everything in between. We also cater for all ages. We run beginner groups for children just starting their musical learning through to those working at county and even national levels. All are welcome and we even run groups for adults!! The centre is a thriving community for all who love music.
