North Yorkshire Careers Guidance Project 'Progression for Success'.

Please find here the <u>Executive Summary Report</u> and <u>Full report</u> from the two year North Yorkshire Careers Guidance Project 'Progression for Success'. The project was supported by £55,000 funding from NYCC and £40,000 from the York, North Yorkshire and East Riding Local Enterprise Partnership. 18 North Yorkshire and 3 City of York school participated in the project.

The report has been produced by the University of Derby, International Centre for Careers Guidance who were commissioned to deliver the evaluation framework. Good progress has been evidenced against the nationally recognised Gatsby Benchmarks for high quality Careers Guidance programmes. Case Studies from the project schools are integrated into the report together with the report key findings and recommendations. An event for all North Yorkshire and City of York schools to disseminate the good practice and share the key findings was held on October 19th, 2017.

Ten project schools have successfully achieved the national quality award for Career Guidance. A further seven schools are partway through the quality award and of these one was waiting for an assessment at the time of the report being written.

This work has had strong support from key partners: colleagues within NYCC Children and Young People's Service, North Yorkshire Business Enterprise Partnership, and colleagues from Careers Yorkshire and the Humber (local National Careers Service delivery), overseen by the YNYER LEP Careers Guidance strategy group.
