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Introducing our Guest Speakers

Tim Buckle, Chimp Management

With specific experience working with children, Tim will be discussing The Chimp Model; a mind management model that helps people become more happy, confident, healthier and successful. It looks at the brain as being divided into 3 teams: You (The Human), The Chimp, and The Computer. The Model helps people in all walks of life including pupils and professionals in education.

Professor Alison Clark-Wilson, UCL Educate Programme

Alison will be analysing the use of artificial intelligence and how it can improve learning outcomes and reduce teacher time. UCL Educate is an associate of the Institute of Ethics for Artificial Intelligence in Education, and will be launching their pilot study to audit school's educational technology needs at the Innovation Festival.

Michael Forshaw, Edtech Impact

Edtech Impact is a free independent school-led marketplace that provides a candid view of which tools are performing well across school demographics. Michael will be discussing the impact and future of edtech in education, and introducing the Edtech Impact Platform which allows schools to trial Edtech software and provide feedback.

Alice Litter & Tom Thacker, Century Tech

Century Tech is an award-winning teaching and learning platform for primary and secondary schools, colleges and universities. Alice, a cognitive neuroscientist, and Tom, Head of Schools, will be exploring artificial intelligence software for use in schools, which is proved to significantly increase outcomes and reduce teacher workload.

Deputy Mitchell, Blogging in Education

Former Headteacher, now an Educational Consultant and blogger. David has proven improved attainment through encouraging children to write and publish blogs; SATS in writing went from 9% (July 2009) to 60% (July 2010) at Level 5 when he initially used this technique.
