Banding replacement for the Can-Do

Audience: All schools

As you are hopefully aware from the recent consultation and approval through School's Forum and the Executive Board, we are changing the way we allocate Element 3 resource for children and young people with EHCPs. Until the 31st March 2019, our method to allocate this resource has been through the Can-Do. From 1st April 2019 NYCC are moving to a banding system to allocate the resource with descriptors at each band.

At the recent SENCO networks, information was shared and training offered to all attendees. I explained that the EHCAR form and the Annual Review form would be slightly amended to remove references to the Can-Do and to add relevant details regarding the banding system. I also agreed to share the final versions of the descriptors – thanks again to SENCO colleagues who attended the networks and who were hugely helpful in suggesting changes to wording to improve clarity. North Yorkshire County Council is responsible for ensuring children between the ages of 13yrs & 16yrs (compulsory school age) who intend to work, or have a job, have a valid employment permit. The Local Authority has produced byelaws which regulate the types of work young people are permitted to do and also the number of hours they are allowed to work. Independent travel training (SEND Transport)

Independent Travel Training (ITT) has now been updated and is no longer able to offer 1:1 practical support to children and young people in this area. We are now providing support in the following areas:

ITT Parent Workshops

A two hour long workshop that gives parents/carers information, guidance and tips on how to help their child become independent. Workshops are starting in May 2019 and should you know any parents/parent groups/carers who may wish to access one of these workshops, then please contact Chrystal Staveley at: SENDtransport@northyorks.gov.uk (SENDtransport@northyorks.gov.uk) If you can help publicise this information on your school newsletters or website then we would be really grateful.

Train the Trainer (ITT for schools/college staff) Train the Trainer workshops are now being delivered to school/college/PLP staff.

This is a free training course and we are asking for at least 2 members of staff from either Learning Support/ATA/HLTA or GTA (if they will have the capacity to help deliver Travel Training within their school). This training will be 1 full day, but can be broken down into sections if this is more convenient.

We are asking for every North Yorkshire School (secondary) and college to have at least two members of staff who have had this Travel Training as parents will be diverted to schools/colleges to ask what their Travel Training offer is going forward.

Training days are starting in June/July 2019.

This is aimed at those young people who may have more complex needs and need some very basic ITT information. This will include basic road safety and how to stay safe when out and about.

This is ideally aimed at those young people who would never be able to travel independently to school or college and just need some basic skills in order to travel within their local community.
