North Yorkshire Youth: Wake-Up Call is <u>free</u> and available to 24 Secondary schools across North Yorkshire and York. Wake-Up Call looks at pre-Prevent work with young people at risk of being radicalised, committing a hate crime or showing negative racial behaviour. The purpose of Wake-Up Call is to develop a counter narrative in young people so they feel more equipped at challenging hate crime and also become ambassadors within their schools.
