Health Protection Update – June 2023

Measles

You may have seen recent press reports regarding the national increase in measles cases. Vaccination is still the biggest defence against this (and other diseases), the link below is from a press release from the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA)- you may wish to share this with staff and parents

Whilst the vaccination rate in North Yorkshire is higher than other areas, we are seeing a decline in all immunisations, and we are currently below the 95% rate that is required for herd immunity.

The Yorkshire and Humber Integrated Care Board (ICB) are planning a major campaign to promote the Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) immunisation over the next few months. We will share this with you once available.

The government has announced the flu plans for the 2023/24 season. Vaccinations in school will be offered to all primary age children – Reception through to year 6.
