Sessions run for one hour, unless otherwise stated on the calendar below.

Sessions are delivered by a range of agencies within NY Safeguarding Children Partnership.

Training Offer	Session's Synopsis and Notes
Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs)	This session will explain Adverse Childhood Experiences and help you understand the impact they have, or may be having on a child's well-being and life chances. It will also provide an insight into why some children behave as they do and examples of how we can teach our children to be resilient.
Attendance and Enforcement	This session will look at the Attendance and Enforcement Pathway and how it is used across schools in North Yorkshire. It will guide colleagues on how to approach the Attendance Pathway and what needs to be implemented prior to referral to the Local Authority Attendance and Enforcement Officers. Information will also be provided around the legal process and the possible outcomes available once the referral has been made.
Building Resilience	This session will look at ways that schools and other agencies can help develop resilience in order to promote mental wellbeing, healthy relationships, academic performance and school attendance. The course will also look at the key role parents have to play in building resilience in children and the ways that agencies might support them in doing so.
CME (Child Missing from Education)	All children of compulsory school age are entitled to an efficient, full time education suitable to their age, ability, aptitude and any Special Educational Needs they may have. This session is appropriate for both primary and secondary school colleagues and will assist you in being more confident in understanding the Local Authority Children Missing Education (CME) pathway.
Compass Phoenix	Compass Phoenix is an emotional wellbeing and mental health service for children and young people aged 9-19. This session provides an overview of what the service offers young people and how it can be accessed, including details of support through one-to-one or group work and BUZZ US, a confidential text messaging service. Plus discover free training and consultation opportunities for staff, providing advice, resources and signposting.

Training Offer	Session's Synopsis and Notes
Contextual Safeguarding	This session is aimed at education settings in line with Keeping Children Safe in Education. All staff, but especially the Designated Safeguarding Leads, should be considering the context within which incidents and/or behaviours of concern occur. This is contextual safeguarding, which simply means assessments of children should consider whether wider environmental factors are present in a child's life, that are a threat to their safety and/or welfare.
Creating Family Support	The saying 'it takes a village to raise a child' is still very true today and for many parents they need the support from within their family or the wider community. This session will explore the intricacies of family networks which can be a bit of a minefield, as family relationships are multi-faceted and complex. We will consider how to find out who are the important players in a child's life and why they matter, who would support the child if asked and what would they want them to offer.
Cyber Crime - Prevent and Protect	Cybercrime is an attractive choice for some, with potentially large returns and young people can be particularly vulnerable targets. This course will give an introduction to Cyber Protect, an insight into Cyber Crime and an understanding of National Cyber Security Advice on how to stay safe online. We will also discuss Cyber Prevent, the referral process, Cyber Choices and the resources available.
Direct Work Tools	You know there is something not quite right, but you are not sure how to find out what is worrying a child - the Direct Work Tools are just what you need. This session introduces you to tried and tested tools that will support you when gathering the "child's voice" enabling children and young people to articulate their thoughts, feelings and emotions.
Drug and Alcohol Awareness	This session offers an overview on the local situation regarding young people's drug and alcohol use, practical up-to-date information on the most commonly used drugs, information on the legal, health and social risks of substance misuse, plus details of where to get further information.
Early Help Assessments and Running Successful Team Around the Family (TAF) Meetings	Are you concerned about a child in your care? Identify what support the child and the family might need by using the Early Help Assessment tool to explore what's going on and how to help their situation. Supporting families to help their children overcome worries or concerns can be daunting, particularly if there are difficult stories or differences of opinion. Getting everyone to agree positive changes for a child is the art of successfully facilitating a Team Around the Family meeting. Discover how the Signs of Safety approach can improve outcomes for children and their families.

Training Offer	Session's Synopsis and Notes
Early Help for Early Years Providers (in two parts)	These sessions include all of the advice and guidance an Early Years provider needs to identify, plan and implement support which children and their families require when they ask for your help, or you have concerns. Delivered in a fun, interactive way, the sessions will provide attendees with the confidence to implement the Early Help Strategy and explain how it can support your service delivery and outcomes for the children in your care.
Early Help for School Pastoral Staff (in two parts)	These sessions include all of the advice and guidance a pastoral worker needs to identify, plan and implement support which children and their families require when they ask for your help, or you have concerns. Delivered in a fun, interactive way, the sessions will provide attendees with the confidence to implement the Early Help Strategy and explain how it can support your
EHE (Elective Home Education)	This session outlines what schools should do if a parent is considering EHE and what rights parents have to EHE. It describes the overall factors which NYC use to assess the suitability of the education and what interventions are used if the education is unsuitable. The session covers pupils who also have an EHCP and/or are on roll of a special school and how these factors impact EHE.
Having Difficult Conversations with Parents	You need to arrange a meeting with a family and you know it is going to be very difficult, or they may not even attend. This session will help you explore how to start rebuilding relationships to work towards positive engagement and outlines a plan that can be used to prepare for a difficult conversation, including a method that may be used to deal with an angry/upset parent.
Introduction to Prevent	Prevent is about safeguarding people and communities from the threat of terrorism. Prevent is one of the four elements of CONTEST, the Government's counter-terrorism strategy. It aims to stop people becoming terrorists or supporting terrorism. This course will give participants an understanding of Prevent, enabling them to recognise indicators of radicalisation and understand reporting processes.
NYC Safeguarding Children	This course focusses on how to recognise when children are at risk of being harmed and how to safeguard them appropriately. This training will equip delegates with the knowledge and skills to enhance their ability to understand and respond to issues concerning safeguarding children. Also includes updates for DSLs and Deputies. There is a cost associated with this course – see NYES website for details.

Training Offer	Session's Synopsis and Notes
<p>NYC Signs of Safety Conferencing Pathway</p>	<p>This course will provide delegates with an understanding of the Child Protection Pathway including strategy meetings, core groups and child protection conferences. It will help develop a knowledge of responsibilities with child protection processes, thresholds and effective participation: report writing and attendance; recognition of “significant harm”</p> <p>There is a cost associated with this course – see NYES website for details.</p>
<p>Obtaining Civil Injunctions for Domestic Abuse Victims</p>	<p>The National Centre for Domestic Violence is a Community Interest Company providing civil protective injunctions (non-molestation, occupation and prohibitive steps orders) for those suffering domestic abuse. The sessions covers the orders, how we assess a case, see if the applicant is eligible for legal aid or will be self-representing (which we would assist them to do free of charge), the benefits of the civil orders available, the court process and how you can make a referral.</p>
<p>Reducing Parental Conflict</p>	<p>For lots of children parental conflict is part of everyday life and, more often than not, parents are not aware of the potential impact it has on their children. Work, finances and household chores are just a few of the competing elements that can cause tensions to rise, disagreements to escalate and arguing to become commonplace. This session is all about how professionals can recognise and understand the impact of parental conflict on a child's well-being and how to support families to make positive changes.</p>
<p>SENDIASS - Our role and responsibilities</p>	<p>SENDIASS North Yorkshire is an arm's length, impartial service for professionals as well as parents, carers and young people 0-25 years old with SEND. This session will focus on the roles and responsibilities of SENDIASS, then concentrate on laws supporting children and young people in their right to education. We will ensure there is time for Q &A's especially about SEN support, but other questions regarding SEND are also welcome.</p>
<p>Sexual Health</p>	<p>These sessions will cover what services and options are available to young people, their family/carers, and professionals. We will use a range of scenarios to enable the audience to consider how young people, cares etc can gain the level of support and advice they need through a range of different situations.</p> <p>This session will cover; walk-in provisions, the under 18's mobile phone service, specialist community and clinical outreach services, what to do if a young person has experienced a sexual assault, how to access advice around emergency contraception and provision of EHC and the emergency coil, sexual Health counselling, condom distribution, chlamydial testing, pregnancy choices, LGBTQ and U 16's accessing services, myths, and confidentiality and consent.</p>
<p>Supporting Children and Young People's Social and Emotional Mental Health</p>	<p>The purpose of this session is to share information about support and services available for children and young people's social and emotional mental health (SEMH) in North Yorkshire and guidance on how to signpost to information and services using the “Mini Marketplace” and the ‘Needs Based Guidance’.</p>

Training Offer	Session's Synopsis and Notes
Supporting LGBT+ Children in Schools	An overview for schools when supporting a child or young person who is exploring their gender and/or sexuality (LGBTQ+) within a whole school approach. This course is appropriate for both primary and secondary schools and will signpost to a range of supportive guidance and resources
Supporting Service Children in Schools	The purpose of this training session is to give you a brief insight into the Armed Forces life and to discuss the issues and challenges Service children and their families might face. These challenges have been shown to impact Service children's well-being and long term outcomes in comparison to their non-service peers, so we will discuss best how to support them.
Understanding the Effects of Domestic Abuse on Children and Adolescents	<p>A 2022 change in law declares that children who witness domestic abuse, or live in a domestic abuse environment, will be automatically treated as a victim of abuse. This training will provide practitioners with a greater understanding of how children are "victims in their own right" when it comes to witnessing domestic abuse. It will cover the effects of domestic abuse on children, signs that a child may be witnessing domestic abuse, young people's use of violence (including CAPVA and IPV), and how to talk to parents about the effect of abuse on children. The session will also outline referrals to support agencies for parents and children.</p> <p>This session is delivered by Foundation's +Choices Services in collaboration with Early Help North Yorkshire.</p>
Understanding the Threshold - Safe Uncertainty (in two parts)	These sessions explore how decisions are made in relation to the NY Safeguarding Children Partnership Threshold Guide and different agencies perspectives on situations. How do we know as professionals when to be concerned and what steps are needed? These sessions will explore how our life experiences, culture and social context all impact on our individual beliefs, routines, expectations and bias in relation to safe uncertainty.
Vulnerability to Radicalisation	<p>An interactive workshop to cover in more detail the following areas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • North Yorkshire and York context and risks • Radicalisation and vulnerability factors • Signs and Symbols for Far Right • Making a referral
