The North Yorkshire & York Healthy Schools Programme goes from strength to strength each academic year. 80% of schools in North Yorkshire have registered with the programme and 120 schools have achieved an award. We welcome York schools some of whom started the award at the end of the summer term. **The Programme is free for all maintained and academy schools in North Yorkshire & York**

Recent evaluation of the programme with schools showed:

There's lots of exciting and diverse habitats your students can discover that will help bring the curriculum to life, shake off the winter blues and add a spring to their step. For example, there's the wonderful alpine house where plants representing biomes from around the world show off their adaptations. Or there's the woodland where students can get their hands dirty investigating the soil at their feet or have hands on exploration of the

And this summer term for a limited time only, there's a fantastic new workshop coming to RHS Garden Harlow Carr: Giving primary children the chance to get amazing close up 3-D views of flower pollen and their pollinators. Teachers can bring their Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 classes to differentiated sessions which offer role play and stimulating hands-on activities so students can have fun learning how important insects are for plants to reproduce.

As well as our workshops, the Garden and Bramhall Learning Centre are available to use for self-guided activities.



North Yorkshire Sustainable Travel Team

The sustainable travel team primary aim is to encourage and support schools to travel in a more sustainable manner (through walking, cycling or using public transport more).

- Modeshift Stars This is a DFT approved site and all schools are encouraged to register with this site. Schools can work on the active travel initiatives and then can gain accreditation which can be used on all the schools promotion, marketing, Ofsted etc. This is free for all schools in the Country. <u>https://modeshiftstars.org/education</u>
- The Active Travel Ambassador (ATA) programme provided by Modeshift Stars supports secondary school pupils with the confidence and skills to address transport issues affecting their school community. With support from an ATA Coordinator and school staff, ATA teams research and develop behaviour change campaigns, focusing on active travel and road safety.



- Sustainable Travel Officer (STO's) can support with events such as 'walk to school' 'cycle to school' active travel events or anything else that encourages pupils and staff to 'move more'.
- STOs can provide Y6 transition assemblies, preparing Y6 students for Y7 through information on route planning, local and school transport options, keeping safe and anything else they need to know (instead of going in the family car).
- Spike the Road Safety hedgehog 'Spike' is used for lots of promotional events for youngers pupils including meet and greet at the school gates (Spike giving out promotional items to those who walk, cycle, scoot to school).



• Parking buddies – STO's regularly 'loan out' parking buddies that can be used for outside schools to reduce the amount of parked cars used. These are used on a loan basis and most schools invest in their own following out 6 week loan period due to their success.


