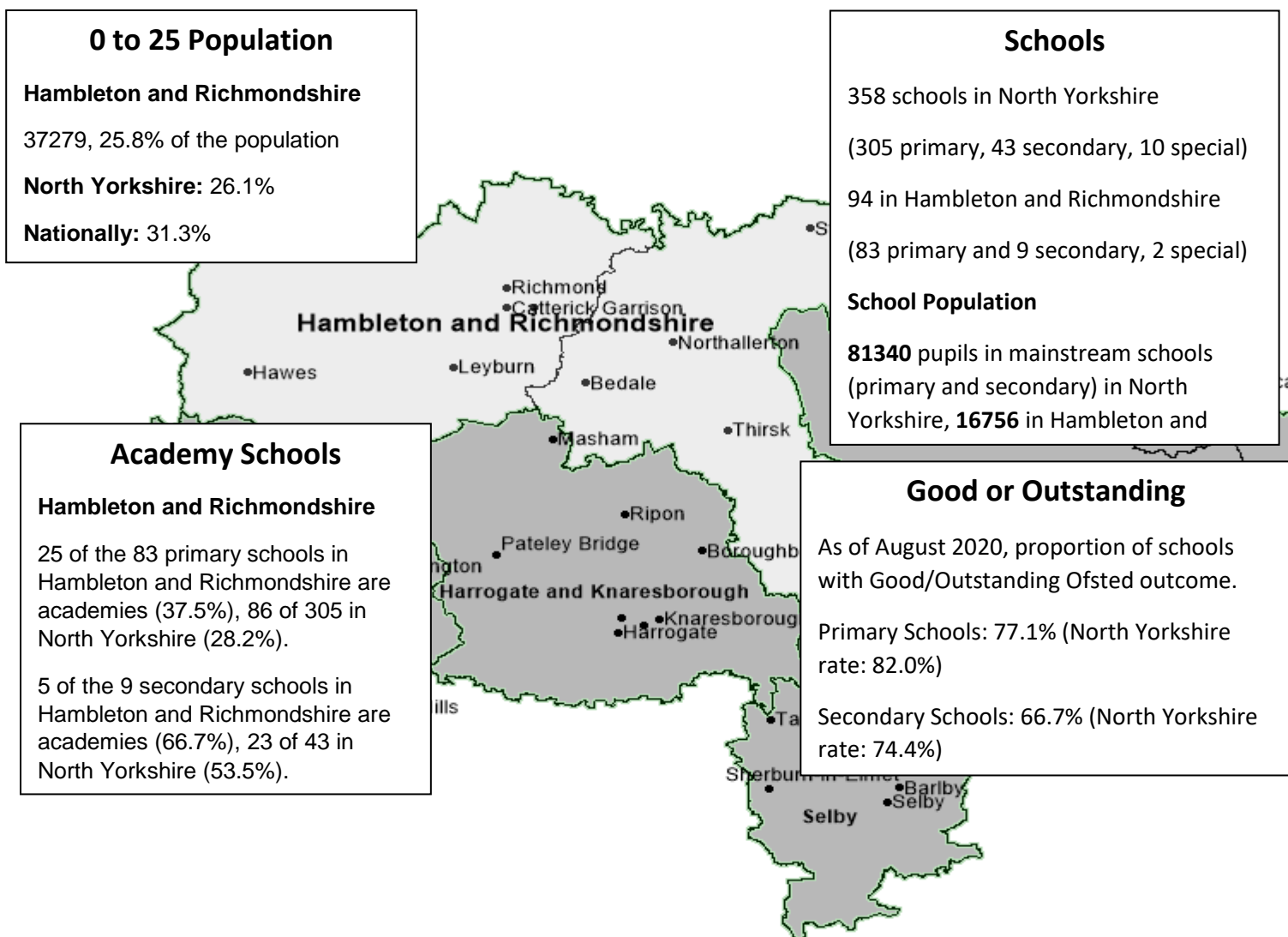


Hambleton and Richmondshire

Locality - performance summary



Headlines – Hambleton and Richmondshire Schools Locality


- **SEN in mainstream schools** - 15.1% of children in Hambleton and Richmondshire schools were recorded as having special educational needs in the January 2020 school census, a higher rate than all other localities in North Yorkshire. The average North Yorkshire rate as a whole is 12.7%
 - The rate of children recorded as SEN Support in the locality was 13.7% of the mainstream school population, which was the highest of the five localities. The average North Yorkshire rate was 11.2%
- The EHC plan rate of the school population (1.41%) was the lowest of the five localities
- **DfE attainment release cancelled** - The publication of results for Early Years Foundation Stage Profile and Key Stage 2 has been cancelled for 2020 (due to Covid-19)
- **Persistent Absence** – the rate of children from secondary schools in Hambleton and Richmondshire being recorded as persistently absent (absent from 10% or more of possible sessions) has been consistently at or above the North Yorkshire average. The persistent absence rate from secondary schools at the end of the Autumn term of 2019/20 was 17.0% compared to 16.8% in North Yorkshire

- **Ofsted Outcomes** – As of August 2020, the rate of primary schools with a ‘Good’ or ‘Outstanding’ outcome in the locality at the most recent Ofsted inspection was 77.1%, below the North Yorkshire average of 82.0%. The secondary school rate was 66.7%, also below the county rate of 74.4%
- **Elective Home Education (EHE)** – At the end of September 2020 there were 673 children living in North Yorkshire and recorded as EHE, there were 129 children recorded as EHE and formerly in a school in Hambleton and Richmondshire, this was 16.2% of the North Yorkshire total of 611 formerly in a North Yorkshire school
 - In the month of September 2020, 23 children from a school in the locality became EHE for any length of time, up from 3 in the same period of 2019. In September 2020, 105 children became EHE from North Yorkshire schools up from 38 in the same period of 2019
- **Exclusions from school** – 4.6% of the secondary school population in the locality were excluded at least once during the 2019/20 academic year. This rate placed Hambleton and Richmondshire the second highest of the five localities for children fixed-period excluded in 2019/20 from secondary schools
 - There were a total of 20 permanent exclusions from Hambleton and Richmondshire secondary schools in the 2019/20 academic year, 43% of the North Yorkshire total (46). This is a 25% increase on the previous year, in 2018/19 there were a total of 16 permanent exclusions from Hambleton and Richmondshire secondary schools, 20% of the North Yorkshire total of 21%



Each of the above figures are similar to last year's rates. Approximately 15% of the 714 requests received by NYCC in 2018/19 were for children in mainstream schools in Hambleton and Richmondshire.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 37% of requests for assessment from Hambleton and Richmondshire schools in 2018/19 resulted in an EHC plan, the lowest rate of the five localities. A proportion of requests received in 2019/20 are yet to be assessed, current comparisons with previous years are not yet available. 108 requests is 0.64% of the mainstream school population, which is lower than the North Yorkshire rate of 0.67%. It is the second highest rate of the five school localities.

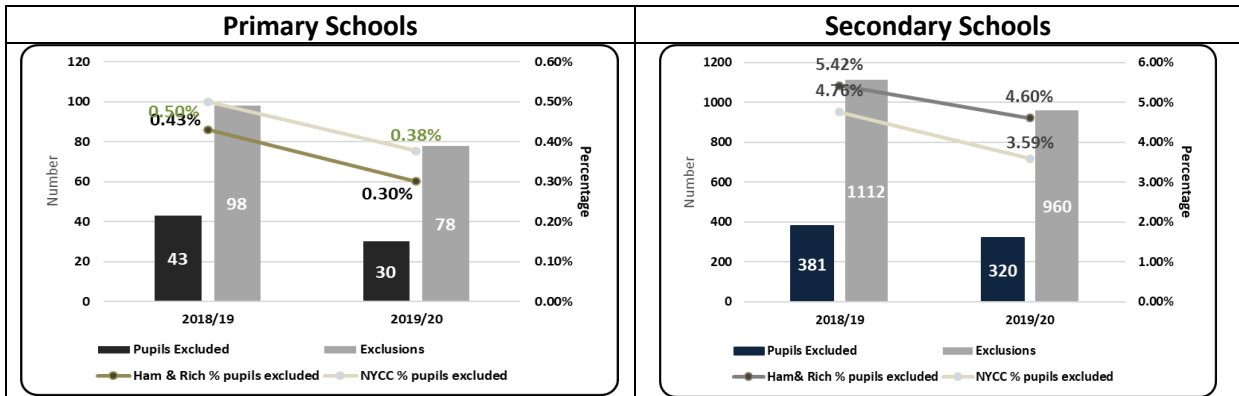

This was a 1.5 percentage point increase on the previous year (71.8% in 2017/18). 29.8% of the SEN cohort (children recorded with EHC plans or SEN Support) in Hambleton and Richmondshire schools achieved a good level of development in 2018/19 which was a 5.8 percentage point increase on the previous year and a higher rate than North Yorkshire as a whole (21.5%).

This was also a lower rate than North Yorkshire as a whole (18.1%).

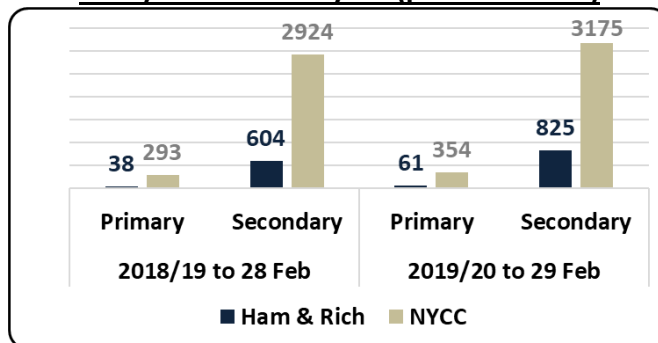
Primary Schools

- 0.30% of pupils (a total of 30 pupils) in Hambleton and Richmondshire primary schools were fixed period excluded at least once in the 2019/20 academic year, which was lower than the North Yorkshire primary school rate (0.38%).
- There were a total of 78 fixed-period exclusions in Hambleton and Richmondshire primary schools in 2019/20, a 20% decrease on the previous year (98 exclusions). Fixed-period exclusions from Hambleton and Richmondshire primary schools formed 18.4% of the North Yorkshire total (425) in 2019/20.

Secondary Schools

- 4.6% of pupils (a total of 320 pupils) in Hambleton and Richmondshire secondary schools were fixed period excluded at least once in the 2019/20 academic year, which was a higher rate than the North Yorkshire secondary school rate (3.6%). This rate placed Hambleton and Richmondshire schools the second highest of the five localities for children fixed-period excluded in 2019/20.

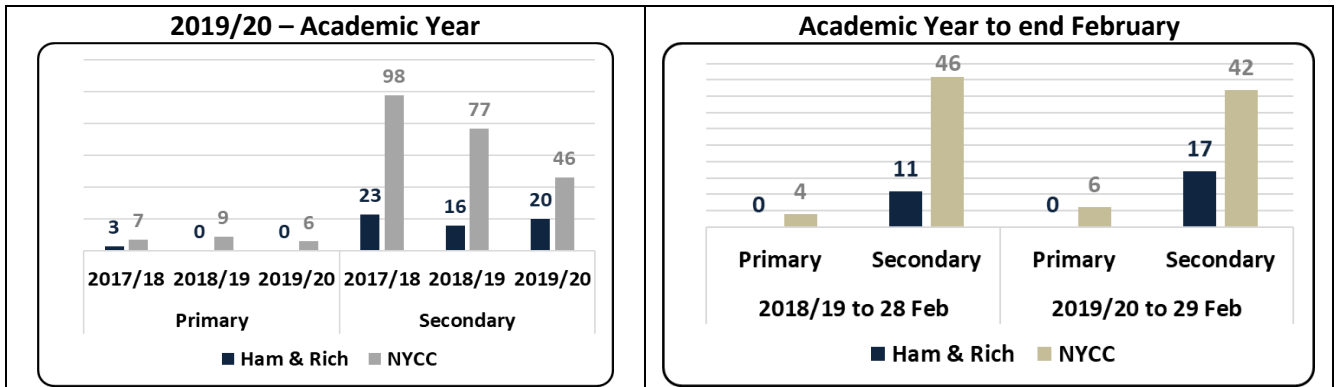
2019/20 academic year (pre-lockdown)



Fixed-Term exclusions in North Yorkshire mainstream schools (Primary and Secondary) - 2018/19 and 2019/20 to end February

- As of the end of February there were a total of 3529 fixed-term exclusions from mainstream schools in North Yorkshire in 2019/20. 887 (25.1%) of these occurred in mainstream schools in Hambleton and Richmondshire.
- There were fewer fixed-term exclusions in the same period in North Yorkshire in the previous year (3217). There has been an increase in Hambleton and Richmondshire of 38.2%, from 642 to 887.

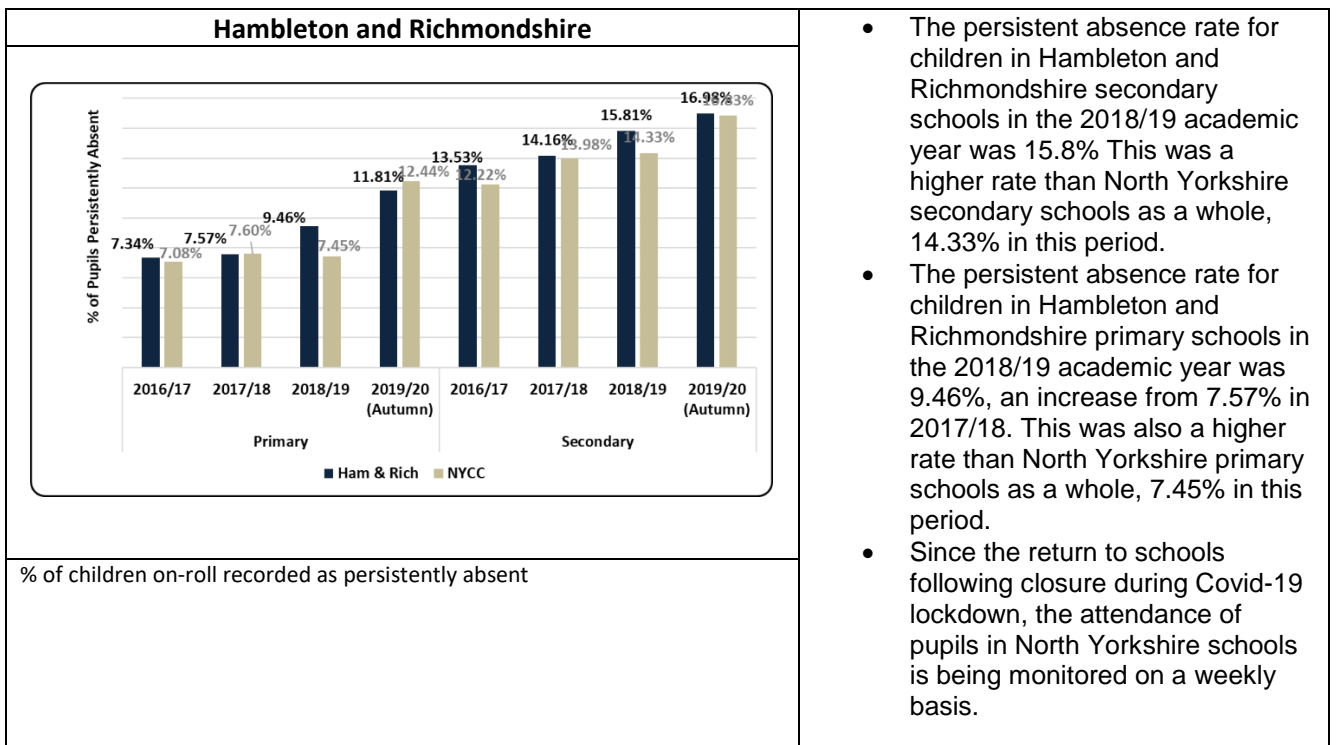
Permanent Exclusions



Permanent exclusions in primary and secondary schools in North Yorkshire and Hambleton and Richmondshire locality

- There were no permanent exclusions from Hambleton and Richmondshire primary schools in the 2019/20 academic year, the North Yorkshire total was 6. In 2018/19 there were also no permanent exclusions from Hambleton and Richmondshire primary schools but there were 3 in 2017/18.
- There were a total of 20 permanent exclusions from Hambleton and Richmondshire secondary schools in the 2019/20 academic year, 43% of the North Yorkshire total (46). This is a 25% increase on the previous year, in 2018/19 there were a total of 16 permanent exclusions from Hambleton and Richmondshire secondary schools.
- To the end of February (pre-lockdown), there were 17 permanent exclusions from Hambleton and Richmondshire secondary schools more than the 11 recorded at the same point in 2018/19.

Persistent Absence



- The persistent absence rate for children in Hambleton and Richmondshire secondary schools in the 2018/19 academic year was 15.8%. This was a higher rate than North Yorkshire secondary schools as a whole, 14.33% in this period.
- The persistent absence rate for children in Hambleton and Richmondshire primary schools in the 2018/19 academic year was 9.46%, an increase from 7.57% in 2017/18. This was also a higher rate than North Yorkshire primary schools as a whole, 7.45% in this period.
- Since the return to schools following closure during Covid-19 lockdown, the attendance of pupils in North Yorkshire schools is being monitored on a weekly basis.

There was a slight decrease for children from Hambleton and Richmondshire mainstream schools in this period of -2% (121 to 118) but an increase of 30% since 2018 (89 to 118). The figures above are for children recorded as being educated at home and not currently on the roll of a school, they are independent of figures relating to the period of school closures during Covid-19 lockdown.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 0.70% is the rate of EHE of the mainstream school population in Hambleton and Richmondshire, which is a higher rate mainstream school population for North Yorkshire (0.64%). The above rate is a decrease from 0.76% (-0.02pp) at the beginning of September, Hambleton and Richmondshire is one of only two localities where there was a decrease observed in this period.
