# The Risedale Way

The Journey to date - the first six months each year in last four equal periods

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### Where are we?

- Based in Catterick Garrison
- Small village of Hipswell
- > 7 potential primary schools on Garrison shared families/issues
- Garrison is largest in Europe and growing from next year to become the third largest town in North Yorkshire behind Scarborough and Harrogate by 2030
- Mobility is often over 30% in a year
- Social deprivation with one of poorest wards in NYCC in catchment
- > 50/50 split between service and civilian families
