In year admissions 2017/18 – key information sheet (KIF)

In September 2016 we introduced some changes to the procedure for dealing with primary in-year admissions. The purpose of the change in procedure is to enable improved information sharing between headteachers prior to a start date being agreed by the new school. The aim was and remains to improve the transition process for families and schools. Following feedback from Headteachers and the Admissions Team (BST) it was evident that the overall understanding of procedures were not clearly understood either by schools or the Admissions Team. In order for the procedures to operate smoothly it was agreed that we would relaunch the process for September 2017.

It is essential that all schools act swiftly in submitting the KIF to the new school. This process will be prompted by receipt of a copy of the in-year allocation letter.

Education, Health and Care Plans

We have been working on a programme to transfer children and young people with a statement of SEN to and Education, Health and Care Plan. All transfers of statements to EHCPs must be completed by 31st March 2018 and the DfE are closely monitoring performance. We are statistically one of the highest performing Las in this area, however still have a considerable number to complete, and meeting the statutory target will prove challenging. We know from experience the length of time it takes to complete transfers, so we need to ensure that meetings are held as soon as possible to enable this work to be achieved in time. Where necessary, we will be contacting schools shortly to ask all meetings are planned as early as possible in September, or brought forward to September if planned for later in the term. Mental Health in Schools – free training

Every secondary school in England is entitled to one free place on a Youth MHFA One Day course through the Youth MHFA in Schools programme. This three year programme is fully funded by the Department of Health with a value of £200 per person trained. In the programme's first year The DoH in partnership with Mental Health England aim to train a member of staff in over 1000 secondary schools to become a Youth MHFA Champion — someone with the skills to spot the signs of mental health issues in young people and guide them to a place of support. By the end of 2020 every secondary school in England will have been offered the opportunity to attend this training. If you work in or with a school that would be willing to host one of the first 100 training courses we Mental Health First Aid would love to hear from you.
