Chickenpox Vaccine – 1st January 2026

From 1st January, the Chickenpox vaccine will be added to the MMR vaccine for children and will be referred to as MMRV vaccine. The MMRV vaccine will be introduced as a two dose vaccine at 12 and 18 months of age for children. Voice of the Child Toolkit and Guidance

HEADCOUNT Spring Term 2026 – Deadline Friday 16th January 2026 <ul style="list-style-type: none">✓ All providers must submit Spring Term 2026 headcount for all funded children✓ Headcount week is 12th January – 16th January 2026✓ DAF evidence must be submitted by 16th January 2026
IMPORTANT CHANGE – Census collection in Spring 2026 <ul style="list-style-type: none">➢ Instead of completing a Census Form in Spring Term 2026 providers will be required to complete a new tab called 'My details' on the portal➢ You will not be able to send your Spring Term 2026 headcount claim without completing the 'My Details' tab, as per the headcount email
ACTION REQUIRED - Check Working Family codes <ul style="list-style-type: none">✓ Check working family codes now for the Spring Term 2026✓ Parents must hold a valid code with a start date on or before 31st December 2025 and an end date on or after 1st January 2026 to access all types of Working Family funding from January
REMINDER – Providers offering stretched funding <ul style="list-style-type: none">➢ If you are a provider offering stretched funding, you must inform the Early Years Funding Team via email if you haven't already➢ You must ensure parents understand how the funded hours are offered on a stretched basis➢ You must indicate which children are accessing stretched funding when submitting headcount actuals.
IMPORTANT – Changes to Your Business <ul style="list-style-type: none">✓ Please contact EYFT (eyft@northyorks.gov.uk), as soon as possible to inform them if you are reducing your funded offer, e.g. reducing days or selling your business✓ This is to ensure any funding paid is accurate✓ Please also update any contact details on the provider portal as and when they happen
