The North Yorkshire Safeguarding Children Partnership (**NYSCP**) supports professionals working with children and families to work together to safeguard and promote their welfare. The partnership comprises three statutory safeguarding partners:

- **Children and Families Service (CFS)**
- **Health (Integrated Care Board)**
- **Police (North Yorkshire Police)**

These partners work alongside relevant agencies, including: **Schools and Education** providers, **Voluntary, Community, and Social Enterprise (VCSE)** groups, and other organisations involved in supporting children and families.
