Daily Covid briefing Wednesday 6th January 2021

- Gavin Williamson has spoken in Parliament this afternoon and made several announcements which are summarised below:
- SATs are cancelled for 2021.
- GCSE and A Level grades will be decided by the schools where pupils attend. We await more guidance on this.
- Extra funding for schools to provide food parcels or meals to eligible pupils; where this is not
 possible, a national voucher scheme will be re-introduced. He did not specify how much funding
 will be made available.
- Those who may have difficulty engaging with remote education (such as no laptop or quiet place to study) have been added to the list of vulnerable children able to attend school - <u>read guidance</u> here.
- Testing for COVID-19 will continue in Secondary Schools.
