Dear Colleagues

We are aware of the pressure on schools with regard to places for critical workers and vulnerable children. Detailed guidance has been published this afternoon by the DfE: <u>Actions for schools during the coronavirus</u> outbreak - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

This guidance includes new information on:

Attendance – including confirmation of who should attend (including in alternative provision and special schools) and how attendance should be recorded

Testing – including confirmation that the testing programme can continue in secondary schools **Workforce** – including advice for those who are extremely clinically vulnerable **Free School Meals**

Educational visits – confirmation that no visits should take place during this period **Remote education** – including further information on remote education expectations **Accountability expectations** – including inspections, exams and assessments

Increasing data allowances on mobile devices to support disadvantaged children

Schools, academy trusts and local authorities can now request help to <u>increase mobile data allowances</u> for children and young people who:

- do not have fixed broadband at home
- cannot afford additional data for their devices
- · are experiencing disruption to their face-to-face education.

Mobile data increases can also be requested when schools report a closure or have pupils self-isolating.

Schools can also make requests for children who cannot attend school face-to-face because they are clinically extremely vulnerable or restrictions pre-vent them from going to school.

If increasing mobile data isn't a suitable option for some children, schools can also <u>request 4G wireless</u> routers.
