SEND – Consultation on changes to the High Needs Budget: 5th Oct - 11th Nov 2018		
 Audience: All Schools As you will be aware, we are currently consulting on three specific proposals for change to the High Needs Budget: Changing the process for top up funding for children and young people with Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs) from a resource allocation system to a banding system. Changing the way provision for secondary aged pupils who are permanently excluded or at risk of permanent exclusion is commissioned and funded in North Yorkshire. Bringing arrangements for provision and funding for young people with EHCPs receiving post 16 education, into line with statutory guidance 	Cascade to: Headteachers, SENCOs and Chair of Governors	
We are consulting on these proposals between 5th October and 11th November 2018.

Urgent advice from Department for Education regarding EpiPen and EpiPen Junior	
Audience: All SchoolsThere is currently a supply issue affecting EpiPen and EpiPen Junior. This is expected to continue for the remainder of 2018. EpiPen is an adrenaline auto-injector device used in emergencies to treat very serious allergic reactions to insect stings/bites, foods, drugs or other substances.The shortage may mean some of your pupils start using a different adrenaline auto-injector that you are less familiar with and/or carrying fewer devices than they normally do. Voice, Influence and Participation update – October 2018

Update from the VIP Team regarding Make your Mark and seeking young people representation on the North Yorkshire Youth Voice Executive.	Headteachers and All school staff
From August 22nd to the 10th October 2018 young people across the country will be asked what issues matter most to them, in order to determine what is debated by the UK Youth Parliament (UKYP) in the House of Commons in November. Voting takes place both online and through ballot papers. Ten topics will be available to choose from on the initial Make Your Mark ballot paper, with the five most popular topics among young people going on to be discussed by Members of the Youth Parliament in their November debate (subject to approval in the new Parliament). Last year's Make Your Mark ballot saw 950,000 young people taking part, making it the largest youth consultation of its kind in the UK.	
In order to widen representation on the Executive we would like to offer more young people from local schools the opportunity to put forward young people from their school to be part of the Executive. The current Executive meets in the holidays and at weekends, about 6 times a year; often in a central location and any travel expenses are covered to allow young people to attend these meetings. The Executive meets with senior managers and decision makers and is responsible for electing the members of the British Youth Parliament, and will be responsible for planning the Youth Voice Conference in 2019.
