The first paper is the School Improvement Strategy. This document some of you will have seen before but we are very keen to get it right and would welcome your comments and suggestions. The consultation is between the 6 November and 6 December 2018. Depending on the feedback received through the consultation, we are planning to implement the strategy or a revised version of it by the 1st February 2019. Your comments are needed to help us shape this strategy and are greatly appreciated.	Action required: Consultation closes on 6 December.
The second paper outlines the consultation on the meeting structures which were also discussed at the Headteacher meetings. We hope that this proposal builds on the great work of the Early Years, Primary, Secondary and Special School Improvement Partnerships, providing a vehicle to discuss and develop both locality and county wide issues in education. The paper considers the terms of reference, the rationale for the change and, proposes the meeting structure moving forward.
