

Course Dates: Academic Year 2021-2022

We welcome applications from primary and secondary teachers at all stages in their careers, including those currently undertaking teacher training programmes. All courses, except for our *Lessons from Auschwitz* CPD, are open to teachers and trainees from across the UK.

Online Teacher Training

Participation in our online teacher training programme is free of charge. All sessions will take place on Zoom. You will need a computer with a camera and microphone to participate.

Online Training Sessions

Introduction to the Holocaust Educational Trust

This 90-minute session will introduce teachers and trainees to the work of the Holocaust Educational Trust and to the pedagogical guidelines which underpin our work. The session will provide a basic introduction to Holocaust history, and to our primary and secondary schemes of work.

An Approach to Teaching about the Holocaust

This optional 90-minute workshop builds on our introductory session to explore our teaching resources and their use in the classroom. Participants must have completed Introduction to the Holocaust Educational Trust before joining this session.

Teacher Study Seminars

Our Teacher Study Seminar series aims to extend historical knowledge, and/or to explore some of the pedagogical challenges of teaching and learning about the Holocaust. Seminars are delivered throughout the year over Zoom, we also hope to be able to offer some of these as in-person sessions around the UK during 2022. Our seminar series will return in October 2021, focusing on the theme of Holocaust Memorial Day 2022, *One Day*. In April 2022 we will be hosting a week of seminars around the theme of *Britain and the Holocaust*.

Exploring the Holocaust: UK Residential Course

Friday 18 February – Tuesday 22 February 2022 • Leicester

Our Exploring the Holocaust residential programme is designed to advance knowledge and inform classroom practice. Educational sessions will be delivered by experts from the Holocaust Educational Trust and prominent academics engaging with the latest scholarship on the Holocaust. The programme has been designed for primary and secondary school teachers from across the UK.

Teacher Study Visit to Vienna

Thursday 24 – Sunday 27 February 2022

Vienna was both one of the great historic centres of European Jewish culture and a key site in the evolution of Nazi antisemitic persecution. This visit will address a wide range of themes including pre-war Jewish life, the long history of antisemitism, the identity and motives of perpetrators, and Austria's complex relationship with the memory of the Holocaust. There will also be a strong focus on the Kindertransport to Britain, making this visit suitable for primary as well as secondary teachers.

Teacher Study Visit to Thessaloniki (Rescheduled)

Monday 30 May – Friday 3 June 2022

This visit will provide an unforgettable educational journey through the unique story of Thessaloniki (Salonica), which was the home of the world's largest community of Sephardic Jews until its almost complete destruction in the Holocaust. The programme will address the distinctive and often overlooked history, culture and experiences of the Sephardim (Jews of Iberian origin) before, during and after the Holocaust.

Lessons from Auschwitz CPD for Teachers

June 2022

Teachers from all subject areas in state secondary schools and colleges across England are invited to apply to this four-part professional development course modelled after our flagship *Lessons from Auschwitz* course for post-16 students. This teacher-only version of the course is held annually and usually comprises a one-day visit to Poland and two educational seminars.

Annual Teacher Training Course at Yad Vashem

Thursday 21 July 2022 (introductory seminar, London)

Friday 29 July – Sunday 7 August 2022 (Israel)

Friday 18 – Sunday 20 November 2022 (follow-up weekend, Leicester)

Our most advanced course is intended for teachers who aspire to lead Holocaust education within their schools, transmitting knowledge to colleagues and developing schemes of work. Teachers will additionally benefit from the educational resources offered by the Yad Vashem International School for Holocaust Studies in Jerusalem.

The programme is composed of a one-day introductory seminar, a 10-day visit to Yad Vashem in Israel and a follow-up weekend. The course gives teachers the opportunity to hear from leading academics, allows for reflection on current classroom practice, and showcases lesson resources.

Costs

Costs for all residential programmes are subsidised. There are no direct charges to teachers for the core costs of the course including lectures and seminars, resources, meals and accommodation. However, please note that participants are required to cover their own travel expenses – for example to Leicester, Vienna or Thessaloniki, or Jerusalem – and any costs associated with this travel (including but not exclusive of insurance, visas etc.)

Our in-person bespoke teacher training workshops/CPD sessions are delivered free of charge, we only ask institutions to cover travel (and where necessary accommodation) for an Education Officer to come out from London.

Teachers taking part in our *Lessons from Auschwitz* CPD project may be required to cover a registration fee.
