Keeping Children Safe in Education

The Department for Education (DfE) has published two new guidance documents for schools and colleges in England for 'Keeping Children Safe in Education', which will come into effect in the next academic year.

'Keeping Children Safe in Education (2016)' should continue to be used by schools and colleges until 3 September 2018, at which time the new guidance comes into effect. Some sections of the guidance will be updated again following the publication of the new 'Working Together to Safeguard Children (2018)' statutory guidance.
