Festival of Friends project - funded by the Armed Forces Community Covenant Fund

I am pleased to report that I have been successful in being awarded a community covenant small fund grant to finance this innovative and exciting project. Working alongside the City of York Council, York University and the University of York St. John, this year-long project is aimed at improving the support schools provide their Service children through CPD and sharing of / developing good practice. It is particularly (but not exclusively) aimed at schools with small numbers of Service children on their rolls.

The project will include an awards scheme (optional for schools to participate in) and the publication of successful case studies. It will culminate in a large, and FREE, campus tour and awards ceremony at one of the universities, aimed at participating schools' staff, pupils and their parents. This is provisionally earmarked for the afternoon and early evening of **Thursday 17th September 2020. The accompanying letter provides more details and an agreement form for participating schools.**

If you are interested, but have not signed up, please email me asap in the first instance and then get the agreement form to me by Friday 27th September. Participating schools will need to identify a staff member to be their *Armed Forces Champion* (who will need to attend up to four short training / network meetings across the year and then disseminate key information to their school colleagues) and run a small school improvement project. These projects can then be submitted to try and win £500 cash prizes (optional).

VE day - 75 years commemoration

This significant event falls on Friday 8th May, 2020 (the 'new' bank holiday) and Cllr Jim Clark, Chairman of the County Council, is keen to plan a large scale event that includes Service pupils being involved in recording oral histories from veterans from that time. Nickie, Jess and I met with him last week to start the planning. We are considering holding two large 1940s street parties involving schools on **Thursday 7th May** – one on the Garrison and the other in the Ripon area. Others might be possible...watch this space!

Service Children's Progression (SCiP) Alliance

Many of you will be aware that I as well as being a member of the SCiP Alliance National Practice Group, I am also providing consultancy support on an exciting funded project. This is creating a school self-evaluation framework of evidence-based effective practice to support the education and welfare of Service children, as well as developing an associated suite of online CPD modules. Whilst this will not be launched until the start of 2020, I intend to roll-out the tool and some of the professional development materials through the *Festival of Friends* project – even more reason to get involved in that!
