

# ASK Suicide Prevention training specifically addresses suicide risk in children and young people aged 5-15

Data is showing that suicide behaviour is increasing among young children and that suicide thoughts in childhood can increase suicide risk in adolescence. This training opportunity is aimed at staff who work in North Yorkshire schools and support pupils.

For schools in North Yorkshire there is one free place available on this training. If the demand is higher than the number of places then priority will initially be given to staff from schools / PRUS with secondary aged pupils.

Feedback from North Yorkshire Schools has been really positive about this course and provided colleagues with tools they can immediately use with young people

#### Outline

The ASK Suicide Prevention training specifically addresses suicide risk in children and young people aged 5-15 and gives participants developmentally appropriate strategies and tools to identify children and young people at risk of suicide and quickly gather and organise key details needed to assess risk and inform safety planning.

### **Description**

The training is provided by an accredited ASK suicide prevention trainer who will be provided with the delegates name and email contact to ensure delegates can access the pre-learning modules and the online training sessions.

#### Delegates will:

- Learn about the risk factors and warning flags signalling that a child may be at risk of suicide.
- How a child's death understanding is related to suicide risk.
- What research tells us about a child's risk and protective factors.
- Practice using an evidence based brief screening tool that anyone can use to match a child who needs support or help to the most appropriate helper.
- How to organise what you know about a child to inform planning for immediate safety and longer-term support.
- How to overcome challenges and partner with parents and other professionals.
- Learn from an experienced facilitator using current practice from clinical practice and published research.

## The training consists of:

- Two self-paced learning modules that must be completed before the online training and will take about an hour in total, including a quiz that helps consolidate the learning in preparation for the two interactive online training sessions
- Attend two online training sessions, over two consecutive days which will be a
  mixture of video case studies, facilitator guided simulations, small group
  discussions, and opportunities to apply your new knowledge using helpful
  tools and resources.
- Upon completion of all components, participants receive a certificate and a pocket reference card.
