Workshops

All standard workshops are available as **on-site** or **outreach** sessions, where we bring the objects to you! **Bespoke sessions** can also be arranged.

As well as a workshop, on-site visits can also include a space for eating lunch, a self-led tour of the museum and use of the gift shop.

We are able to adapt workshops to suit the needs of your class, so please get in touch with any specific requirements.

OBJECT HANDLING FOR RECEPTION

Historical Toys / Historical Homes

Handle and describe themed objects, then make contrasts and comparisons between modern and historical items using supporting images.

For these informal sessions, museum staff will lead small groups of about 3 children in a handling and Q&A session, each lasting around 5 minutes, while the rest of class continues with normal lesson time or explores the museum.



EXPLORING ART

Use artwork from the museum collection to investigate colour and line, then spark your imagination by "stepping into a painting" and creating a story!

TOYS OF THE PAST

Compare toys used by two real Victorian children from Skipton, then try out some historical toys and games for yourself!



VICTORIAN CRAVEN: HOMES OF THE PAST

Use museum objects to explore life in a Victorian household, comparing past and present, then get hands-on with some Victorian-style washing!





ROMANS IN CRAVEN

Re-enact the story of the Romans and the local Brigantes tribe, then use museum objects to explore ancient life at Kirk Sink Roman Villa and develop your archaeology skills!

STONE AGE TO IRON AGE

Explore how and why prehistoric tools changed over time and channel your inner-archaeologist to investigate some real artefacts!





THE HOME FRONT IN CRAVEN

Use museum objects and immersive experiences to explore what life was like for people in Craven during World War Two, from rationing and worker shortages to taking in evacuees!

Discovery Boxes

Craven Museum offers a loan box service to schools and groups to enhance learning through interaction with real and replica objects. Each box centres on a theme and includes handling instructions and information about the objects inside, as well as some suggested classroom activities.

Loans cost £7.00 per week and can last up to 2 weeks, although we may be able to accommodate longer loans in some circumstances.

Available boxes include:

- Treasures of the Deep Explore the world of minerals, fossils and shells with objects including an ammonite, agates and fossilised coral.
- Turned to Stone Discover what Craven's landscape would have been like by examining the fossils of creatures and plants from the past.
- Stone Age Box Learn about life in the Stone Age with a variety of tools, from axe to harpoon.
- Romans Box Investigate a variety of items linked to Roman life, from mosaics to a wax tablet and stylus.
- Medieval Box Step into the Middle Ages by looking at a variety of household objects, from pottery to candles.
- Beth's Box Explore the life of a Victorian maid with objects such as a pie funnel, metal hot water bottle and candle snuffer.

- John's Box Explore the life of a Victorian schoolchild with objects such as a textbook, slate and dip pen.
- Toys Box Discover the history of play with toys mostly from the 19th and 20th centuries, such as building blocks, a cup and ball, a drum and various game sets. As well as historical handling items, this box also includes a selection of modern replicas which can be played with.
- School Days Uncover the story of school life in the 1920s, 30s and 40s with objects such as a satchel, school bell, milk bottle and games.
- Home Front Investigate daily life on the Home Front during World War Two by exploring various items, from public information leaflets and posters to a ration book and replica gas mask.

Arts Award

Arts Award is a range of recognised qualifications awarded by Trinity College London which support children and young people aged 5-25 to grow as artists and arts leaders. Through Arts Award, they develop creative, critical and communicative skills by completing challenges in particular art forms. Successful participants receive an official certificate.

At Skipton Town Hall, our current Arts Award opportunities enable young people to explore and be inspired by the Craven Museum collection.

Arts Award Discover

Participant requirements:

- Take part in arts activities and identify different types of art
- Find out about an artist or craftsperson
- Share what has been learned

Workshop contents: Hunting for art forms in the museum, researching someone whose work is on display, trying out art activities led by museum staff and sharing experiences through paired discussions or in a school-based activity later (e.g. an assembly).

Cost: £95.00 plus certificate costs for each child.*

Capacity: Available for up to 30 pupils at once.

Duration: 3.5 hours including time for packed lunches (or 2.5 if you choose to complete the final part of the award back at school).





Bronze Arts Award

Participant requirements:

- Take part in and reflect upon arts activities
- Experience and review an arts event/s, then share thoughts with others
- Research and present findings about an artist or craftsperson
- Pass on an art skill by planning and teaching a lesson to others, then reflect upon how it went

Programme contents: We can run Bronze Arts Award programmes either independently or collaboratively with a school teacher. Programmes vary according to group requirements.

• Independent programmes: Typically this involves following a set theme reflected in the museum collection. Participants try several arts activities based on that theme, explore the theme in the museum through a tour and/or trail, research artists linked to the theme and invite a friend/family member on-site

to be taught a skill learned during their earlier arts activities.

• Collaborative programmes: A trained Arts Award Advisor will support the teacher to plan and deliver most of the content in school through regular meetings and some outreach visits, as well as a school visit to Craven Museum. Where possible, the award is linked to the normal school curriculum.

Cost: £90.00 per participant (independent) or £330.00 plus certificate costs* (collaborative).

Capacity: Subject to availability. (Due to the demands of each programme, we are usually only able to offer one per year for a maximum of 30 pupils at once.)

Duration: Equivalent to 2-hour weekly sessions over approximately 4 months/a school term.
