PSHE network meeting for primary, secondary and special schools

I am aware we have lots of new PSHE leads in schools so we thought we would provide further information on the networks and hopefully the benefits of attending the termly network meeting which *remain free for all North Yorkshire and York schools (maintained, academy and private schools).*

The aim of the network meetings is to provide a focus on the PSHE curriculum, which is inclusive of the statutory Relationships, Sex & Health Education (RSHE) the safeguarding curriculum and personal development provision.

The network supports PSHE subject leads to:

- remain up-to-date on national and local aspects in relation to PSHE, personal development and healthy schools programme and signposting to supporting resources.
- **implement and monitor an effective planned PSHE curriculum** which meets the statutory RSHE curriculum and a safeguarding curriculum.
- opportunity to access input as part of the network meetings from experts in their field to remain up to date with current effective practice and gain knowledge, understanding and practical insight from professionals e.g last academic year we have had sessions from money heroes, diversity role models, compass phoenix, picture news etc.
- **network with colleagues** from a range of schools to share good practice and discuss shared challenges.

Outcomes

As a result of attending, delegates should be able to remain up-to-date in relation to PSHE and therefore **continually support their school effectively deliver a well planned and monitored PSHE curriculum that is meeting the statutory requirements** of the relationships, sex and health education, providing a safeguarding curriculum and meeting the needs of pupils.

The North Yorkshire & York Healthy Schools Programme

The North Yorkshire& York Healthy Schools Programme goes from strength to strength each academic year. 80% of schools in North Yorkshire have registered with the programme and 138 schools have achieved an award. We welcome York schools some of whom started the award at the end of the summer term. **The Programme is free for all maintained and academy schools in North Yorkshire & York**

The Healthy Schools Programme enables school to audit and evidence their practice against best practice to improve the health and wellbeing of the whole school community across four key themes alongside staff wellbeing. Schools can work on the themes in any order and is an excellent way to showcase the good practice the school is delivering to support the Personal Development provision.

- Active Lives
- Food in Schools
- PSHE
- Emotional Health and Wellbeing

Schools work towards Bronze; one theme, Silver; two themes plus staff wellbeing and Gold being the final two themes.





We now have the Gold Renewal award for any schools that achieved their Gold award over or within the last three years. Alongside this schools who have achieved the Gold award can work towards the Platinum Award where the school decides on their own health and wellbeing priority.

We really recommend that schools attend the FREE 'Getting Started Training' to enable a successful submission for a Healthy Schools award. Being Active

Supporting Information following events over the summer

Whilst PSHE education should follow a planned programme, we recognise that PSHE and Citizenship provide space and opportunity for timely support for children and young people when difficult and upsetting things happen in our world.

Pupils may have recently seen news items / social media about the recent disorder, including violent attacks on police colleagues and arson attacks on hotels that host asylum seekers. The BBC reports that the violent disorder in towns and cities is in part due to false claims on social media.

The following information, advice and resources may help professionals manage conversations with children and young people about these events and also increase digital literacy to help children and young people identify misinformation and fake news:

- The importance of establishing a safe learning environment from the <u>PSHE</u> <u>association</u> alongside <u>'Safe classroom' and 'effective teaching' interactive posters</u>
- <u>Educate against Hate</u> Government advice and trusted resources to help safeguard students from radicalisation, build resilience to all types of extremism and to promote British Values . They have put specific information and support together focused on the events over the summer which is accessible here
- <u>Newswise for 7-11 year olds (NewsWise | The Guardian Foundation</u>) NewsWise aims to empower children with the skills and knowledge to engage with and enjoy news, to feel confident to ask questions and to challenge misinformation, and to have their own values and opinions. This includes a lesson on managing feelings about the news and identifying the difference between fact and opinion. The resource is suitable for upper primary and lower secondary pupils.
- <u>Primary and Secondary Find the Fake</u> (Find the fake quiz Internet Matters)
- Secondary school <u>Going Too Far?</u> is an interactive classroom resource developed by the Department for Education and London Grid for Learning, which aims to help students understand extremism and how certain online behaviour may be illegal or dangerous. The resource for secondary school pupils aims to promote critical thinking and build resilience.
- <u>Reliability Online</u>: An interactive resource from Childnet co-produced with their Youth Advisory Board to help young people aged 13-16 decide what they can trust when they are online




