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# **Energy contract and pricing updates**

#### **Electricity: Contract issues**

<u>Letters of Authority</u> - There was an issue at the start of the contract where EDF was requesting Letters of Authority; this is sorted out now, however any instances please contact <u>energy.team@northyorks.gov.uk</u>.

<u>MOP payments</u> - Meter Operator invoices have been issued again this year. We have been working with EDF to have the costs added as a line on the supply invoices but unfortunately the change did not stick for this financial year. EDF are currently putting in place this change for coming years and investigating how they can make the change for this year. If you have paid your MOP invoice please retain all paperwork, and if you have not paid it yet then please don't until you hear from us again.
