Ofcom media use and attitudes report 2024

Ofcom have published their <u>media use and attitudes report</u> for 2024. This report looks at media use, attitudes and understanding among children and young people aged 3-17.

It also includes findings on parents' views about their children's media use, and how parents of children and young people aged 3-17 monitor and manage their children's use.

The report provides a comprehensive picture of children's media experiences in 2023
