The North Yorkshire & York Healthy Schools Programme The

North Yorkshire& York Healthy Schools Programme goes from strength to strength each academic year. 80% of schools in North Yorkshire have registered with the programme and 161 schools have achieved an award.. The Programme is free for all maintained and academy schools in North Yorkshire & York

The Healthy Schools Programme enables school to audit and evidence their practice against best practice to improve the health and wellbeing of the whole school community across four key themes alongside staff wellbeing. Schools can work on the themes in any order and is an excellent way to showcase the good practice the school is delivering to support the Personal Development provision.

- Active Lives
- Food in Schools
- PSHE
- Emotional Health and Wellbeing
- Plus staff wellbeing for the Silver Award

Schools work towards Bronze; one theme, Silver; two themes plus staff wellbeing and Gold being the final two themes. Schools who have achieved the Gold Award can now work towards the Gold Renewal Award (after holding Gold for three years) and a Platinum award.

NSPCC secondary education service Talk Relationships

Talk Relationships supports secondary school teachers and leaders to confidently deliver effective and inclusive sex and relationships education. It ensures young people can learn about sex and relationships in a safe education environment that recognises, responds to, and prevents abuse.

NSPCC want all young people to understand healthy behaviours in relationships and recognise their right to be safe, heard, and respected. And we want them to know how to get help from a trusted adult if they need it.

Talk Relationships includes:

- A <u>free</u> e-learning course for teachers, that addresses their specific needs when delivering sex and relationships education.
- A <u>free</u> e-learning course, specifically tailored to school leaders, on implementing a whole-school approach to sex and relationships education.
- 14 free, ready-to-teach lesson plans and resources, also available in Welsh.
- 6 SEND-specific lesson plans, adaptable for the needs of different students.
- A helpline dedicated to supporting secondary school educators with help and advice to deliver effective sex and relationships education.
- We have recently released a Whole-School Approach Framework to sex and relationships education. The framework is made up of 5 <u>free</u> documents that, when used together, will support school leaders to implement a whole-school approach to sex and relationships education based on evidence and best practice.

Growing Up in North Yorkshire Survey 2024

Thank you to all schools who took part in the Growing up In North Yorkshire Survey in 2024. Just a reminder that the County report and Area Reports are freely available via the <u>Healthy</u> Schools Website

The identified priorities from the County data are:

- Though some improvements have been seen in children and young people's
 resilience and emotional wellbeing this is not consistent between genders, the
 older age groups and social identity groups, therefore it needs to continue as a
 priority.
- Respond to the emerging data about young people not always seeking out either a trusted adult or service for support and information about things that may be worrying them

- Continue to respond to online safety risks including a focus on primary-aged pupils
 who have unsupervised access to technology / TVs in their room after they have
 gone to bed and who communicate online with people they don't know.
- Promote a healthy bedtime routine for children and young people, including information on the correct amount of sleep for their age and promoting technology-free bedrooms.
- Though some improvements have been seen in supporting and encouraging a
 healthy lifestyle and positive body image there needs to be a continued focus on
 hand washing, oral health, healthy eating (especially for secondary school pupils), the
 gender imbalance in relation to physical activity, and ensuring all pupils have access to
 swimming.
- Continue to respond to the number of children and young people using vapes and the emerging data around snus and cali pens
- Continue to support all schools to implement an effective and well planned PSHE curriculum but with a focus on the secondary curriculum
- Continue to support schools and partners to reduce bullying and prejudice-based incidents in schools and the wider community through developing effective inclusive practice including a focus on identified groups of young people who continue to have more negative outcomes against a wide range of indicators
