On **18 March 2026**, partners across North Yorkshire are asked to support **National Child Exploitation Awareness Day**, led by the [NWG Network](#). The national theme this year is **preventing abuse through exploitation by working in partnership**, reinforcing that safeguarding children is a **shared responsibility** across agencies, communities and the wider public.

Child exploitation is a form of abuse where children and young people are **manipulated, coerced, threatened or groomed** into sexual or criminal activity. Children are **always victims**, and exploitation can happen online or in the physical places and spaces where children spend their time.

Key partnership messages

Below are some of the key partnership messages that we would like partners to share and promote across teams and networks: (Hyperlinks take you to supporting documents).

- Child exploitation is happening in North Yorkshire, and all children can be vulnerable.
- We all have a role in spotting concerns, sharing information and [disrupting](#) harm.

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- [Professional curiosity matters](#); every interaction is an opportunity to notice change and act early.
- [Sharing intelligence](#) with the police and partners is one of the most effective ways to disrupt exploitation.
- Children and young people cannot consent to exploitation – [the language we use matters](#) to ensure children are seen as the victim and never blamed.

Social media and emojis - uncracking the code to tackle exploitation. 18th March 12:00 – 13:00

Delivered by Gemma Ohr, this one-hour session is designed for anyone seeking a deeper understanding of how exploitation occurs online in relation to drug sales, the concerning applications being used, and what online drug dealing typically looks like.

The session will examine why social media platforms are being utilised for drug supply and how emojis and specific language are used to facilitate this. It will also highlight keyways to help young people stay safe when navigating these online spaces.

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North Yorkshire Police: Virtual reality of knife crime - ground-breaking tech to keep young people safe 19th March 12:00 – 12:30

In this free 30-minute online session, North Yorkshire Police will share information relating to the use of an immersive 360-degree film that aims to build an emotional understanding of the devastating impact of knife crime among children and young people. "One knife destroys more than one life" is delivered to young people through VR headsets, with the viewer witnessing a tragic incident from multiple perspectives, stepping into the shoes of everyone affected.
