The Government have updated the Statutory Relationships, Sex and Health Education Guidance for schools with implementation by September 2026

The aim of the updated guidance document is to support pupils develop **knowledge and skills** that will enable them to make **informed** and **ethical decisions** about their **wellbeing, health and relationships**. Based on **guiding principles** for relationships, sex and health education, **effective teaching, engagement with parents and carers** and a statutory relationships and sex education **policy**.

To support schools effectively implement the changes a range of **briefing sessions, training opportunities** and **in-school support** are available such as a PSHE support visit and / or staff training. The North Yorkshire & York Healthy Schools Programme

The North Yorkshire & York Healthy Schools Programme goes from strength to strength each academic year. Over 80% of schools in North Yorkshire have registered with the programme and 168 schools have achieved an award. **The Programme is free for all maintained and academy schools in North Yorkshire & York**

The Healthy Schools Programme enables school to audit and evidence their practice against best practice to improve the health and wellbeing of the whole school community across four key themes alongside staff wellbeing. **Schools can work on the themes in any order and is an excellent way to showcase the good practice the school is delivering to support the Personal Development provision.**

- Active Lives
- Food in Schools
- PSHE
- Emotional Health and Wellbeing
- Plus staff wellbeing for the Silver Award

Schools work towards Bronze; one theme, Silver; two themes plus staff wellbeing and Gold being the final two themes. Schools who have achieved the Gold Award can now work towards the Gold Renewal Award (after holding Gold for three years) and a Platinum award.

For schools that have registered with the award and need a quick refresh of how to submit for an award we now have some '**Applying for an award guidance**' available when you log in sign into your school account under each theme section.

We really recommend that schools attend the FREE 'Getting Started Training' to enable a successful submission for a Healthy Schools award. This training is aimed at schools newly signed up to the programme or schools that have previously registered but need a re-fresh of how to achieve an award. The guidance provides self-evaluation assessment tools and examples of practical actions that schools can take to mitigate the impact of poverty within their school environment and improve the school experience for all pupils. There is a free Action on Poverty certification process for schools through engaging with the self-assessment tools.

Growing up in North Yorkshire Survey 2026

In January 2026 all state funded schools and academies in North Yorkshire will be asked to sign up for FREE to take part in the Growing up in North Yorkshire survey 2026.

The North Yorkshire Children and Young People's Service (CYPS), Public Health and North Yorkshire Police have again commissioned a **survey of children and young people covering aspects of learning, safeguarding and well-being**, to take place in the summer term 2026. The survey will continue to provide key information about the learning, safety and wellbeing of **children and young people across Years 2, 6, 8, 10 and 12, in mainstream schools and in special schools and PRUs**. The outcomes from the survey can be used to inform schools self-evaluation and planning as well as the strategic planning for the Children and Young People's Service and partners. Participation in this survey hugely supports our understanding of children and young people's wellbeing and any safeguarding-related issues across the whole of North Yorkshire.



- gain knowledge of how to keep themselves healthy
- make informed choices about healthy eating, and fitness
